QUICK TIPS: MSF's Guide to Group Riding

Motorcycling is primarily a solo activity, but for many, riding as a group — whether with friends on a Sunday morning ride or with an organized motorcycle rally — is the epitome of the motorcycling experience. Here are some tips to help ensure a fun and safe group ride:

- **Arrive prepared. Arrive on time with a full gas tank.**
- **Hold a riders' meeting. Discuss things like the route, rest and fuel stops, and hand signals .**
- **Assign a lead and sweep (tail) rider. Both should be experienced riders who are well-versed in group riding procedures. The leader should assess everyone's riding skills and the group's riding style,**
- **Keep the group to a manageable size, ideally five to seven riders. If necessary, break the group into smaller sub-groups, each with a lead and sweep rider.**
- **Ride prepared. At least one rider in each group should pack a cell phone, first-aid kit, and full tool kit, so the group is prepared for any problem that they might encounter.**
- **Ride in formation. The staggered riding formation (see diagram below) allows a proper space cushion between motorcycles so that each rider has enough time and space to maneuver and to react to hazards. The leader rides in the left third of the lane, while the next rider stays at least one second behind in the right third of the lane; the rest of the group follows the same pattern. A single-file formation is preferred on a curvy road, under conditions of poor visibility or poor road surfaces, entering/leaving highways, or other situations where an increased space cushion or maneuvering room is needed.**
- **Avoid side-by-side formations, as they reduce the space cushion. If you suddenly needed to swerve to avoid a hazard, you would not have room to do so. You don't want handlebars to get entangled.**
- **Periodically check the riders following in your rear view mirror. If you see a rider falling behind, slow down so they may catch up. if all the riders in the group use this technique, the group should be able to maintain a fairly steady speed without pressure to ride too fast to catch up.**
- **If you're separated from the group, don't panic. Your group should have a pre-planned procedure in place to regroup. Don't break the law or ride beyond your skills to catch up.**
- **For mechanical or medical problems, use a cell phone to call for assistance as the situation warrants.**

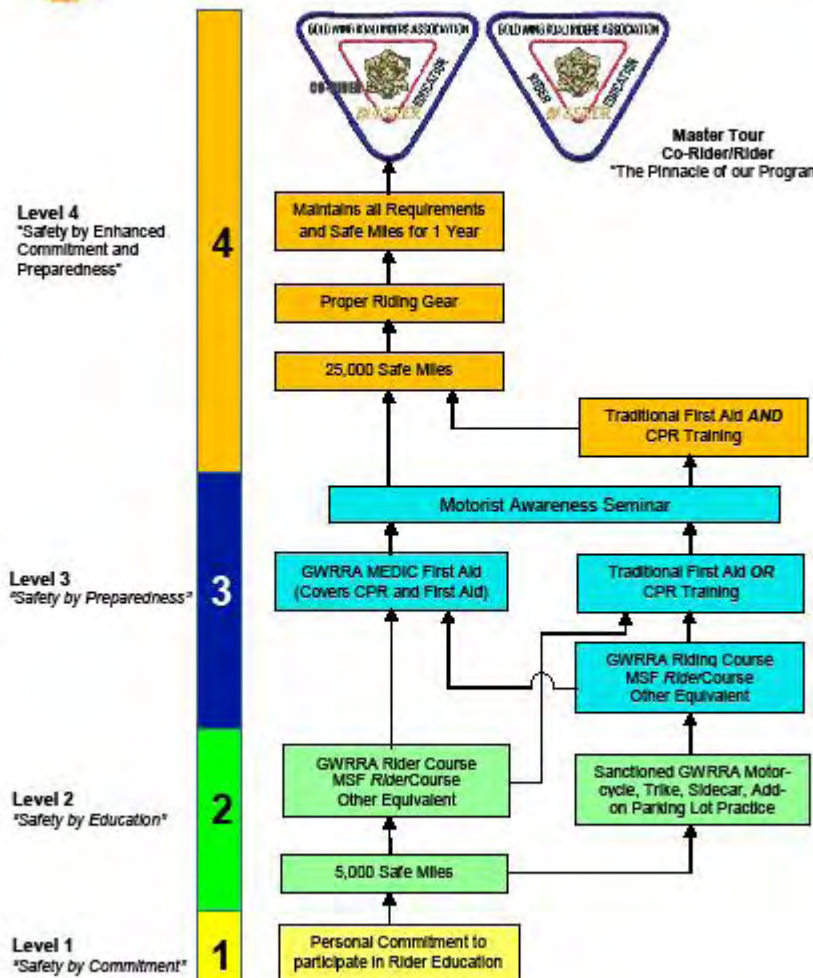

IT'S THAT WONDERFUL TIME OF THE YEAR—AGAIN!

Ah, Daylight Savings Time—that wonderful time of the year where we “spring” ahead an hour (translation; you lose an hour of your life) in order to experience more daylight at the end of the day. Studies show that the Monday following this change over report an increase in accidents (all kinds) and productivity at work suffers greatly because it messes with our bodies biorhythms. Making us tired, out of sorts, etc. At least that is the argument

It also means that it is now darker in the morning when commuting to work or school. This darkness in connection with out or sort biorhythms leads to what we consider unsafe practices. Case in point: The other day, when commuting to work, I approached a “T” intersection where I had the stop sign. While some lightness was just occurring on the horizon, I would actually still call it dark. I wanted to turn right onto this road. Oncoming traffic has no restrictions. I looked left and saw nothing. I then looked right and saw nothing. Fortunately I believe in “Look Twice, Save a Life”, so I looked left again and made out a

black pick-up truck barreling up the road just barely visible running with no lights on. If I had not looked a second time I would have pulled out right in front of it. Speed limit on this stretch of road is 45 mph. (In other words 60 mph in the Atlanta area) Bottom line; it would not have been pretty!

My first reaction was anger. How could someone blatantly drive in the dark with no lights on—too lazy to turn on the headlight switch? I figured they had to be breaking the law so I went to a Georgia DMV site (DMV.org) that simplifies the motor vehicle code and discovered this:

Headlight Laws: *Headlights must be on a half hour after sunset to a half hour before sunrise. Headlights must also be on when it is raining and when visibility is reduced to under 500 feet.*

Are you kidding me? Headlights are only required a half hour after sunset to a half hour before sunrise! What has happened to common sense? One would think they not only want to see where they are going, but be seen as well. Visibility prevents accidents! What are our legislators thinking?

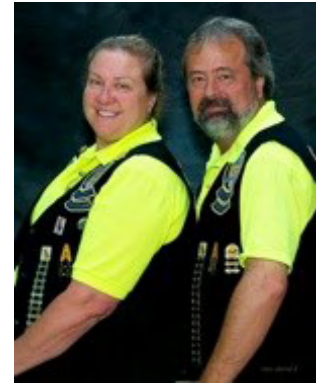
So what we need to learn from this is that we always need to be on top of our game, especially when faced with changes. Whether it is an illness, stressful time in our life, change in the time standards or simply a change in routine, we need to always increase our focus on task and perform everything we do with due diligence.

Life, as well as riding a Motorcycle or Trike, is filled with risk. If we identify the risk, accept that it exists and do all we can to minimize that risk it can lead to a long, happy and safe journey. Additionally, if you do not subscribe to the “Look Twice, Save a Life” philosophy, please do so!

A while back we attended a Chapter Q gathering and their Educator, Paul Vrahiotes, ended his presentation with something like, “Ride Paranoid, because they are out to get you!” It seems to us that there is a lot of sense in that statement because it makes us increase our “Situational Awareness”. I think we can all agree that philosophy can make the difference between a bad day and a good day!

Be Safe—We'll See You On The Road!
