QUICK TIPS: Preventing Motorcycle Theft

Follow these basic tips to help avoid becoming a victim of motorcycle theft:

Lock your ignition and remove the key. Most bike thefts occur when the ignition is shut off, but not locked.

- Lock the forks or disk brakes with locks that have large, brightly colored tags.
- If traveling with other riders, lock motorcycles together when not in use.
- If riding alone, lock your bike to a secure, stationary object that can't be easily dismantled, such as a light pole.
- Add an audible alarm to your motorcycle.
- When traveling and spending the night at a hotel, locate an outdoor security camera and park your bike in the camera's view. If this is not possible, park your bike close to your room.
- Keep an eye on your bike. When parking at a public event, check your motorcycle periodically, especially immediately after leaving your bike, to make sure there are no suspicious individuals lurking about.
- If parking in a garage, block your bike with automobiles, close the garage door and make sure it is locked.
- Don't store your title in your bike's storage compartment, tank bag or saddlebag. The safest place for your title is at home.
- Uniquely *mark* and then photograph your bike. If thieves take your bike, note its unique markings to law enforcement using the photos you have taken.

Keep your bike registration and insurance identification card on you when you ride.

• Be careful about giving out private information on where you live, work or play.





HOW TO SURVIVE A HEART ATTACK WHEN ALONE

Let's say it's 6.15pm and you're going home (alone of course), ...after an unusually hard day on the job. You're reall...y tired, upset and frustrated.

Suddenly you start experiencing severe pain in your chest that starts to drag out into your arm and up into your jaw. You are only about five miles (8kms) from the hospital nearest your home. Unfortunately you don't know if you'll be able to make it that far. You have been trained in CPR, but the guy that taught the course did not tell you how to perform it on yourself..!!



NOW HOW TO SURVIVE A HEART ATTACK WHEN ALONE..

Since many people are alone when they suffer a heart attack, without help, the person whose heart is beating improperly and who begins to feel faint, has only about 10 seconds left before losing consciousness.

However, these victims can help themselves by coughing repeatedly and very vigorously. A deep breath should be taken before each cough, and the cough must be deep and prolonged, as when producing sputum from deep inside the chest.

A breath and a cough must be repeated about every two seconds without let-up until help arrives, or until the heart is felt to be beating normally again. Deep breaths get oxygen into the lungs and coughing movements squeeze the heart and keep the blood circulating.

The squeezing pressure on the heart also helps it regain normal rhythm. In this way, heart attack victims can get to a hospital.

Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month (May 2013) National Ride to Work Day (June 17, 2013)

Motorcycle Awareness

Motorcyclists have all the same rights and privileges as any motor vehicle driver on the roadway. During Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month in May - and during the rest of the year - drivers of all other vehicles and all road users are reminded to safely "share the road" with motorcyclists, and to be extra alert to help keep motorcyclists safe.

Tips for drivers to help keep motorcyclists safe on our roadways.

- Remember, a motorcycle is a vehicle with all of the rights and privileges of any other motor vehicle.
- Always allow a motorcyclist the full lane width—never try to share a lane.
- Perform a visual check for motorcycles by checking mirrors and blind spots before entering or exiting a lane of traffic, and at intersections.
- Always signal your intentions before changing lanes or merging with traffic.
- Don't be fooled by a flashing turn signal on a mo-torcycle motorcycle signals are often not self-canceling and riders sometimes forget to turn them off. Wait to be sure the motorcycle is going to turn before you proceed.
- Allow more following distance three or four seconds when behind a motorcycle so the motorcyclist has enough time to maneuver or stop in an emergency.
- Never tailgate. In dry conditions, motorcycles can stop more quickly than cars.
- Never drive while distracted.

motorcyclists can increase their own safety by:

- Avoiding riding in poor weather conditions.
- Wearing brightly colored protective gear and a DOT-compliant helmet.
- Using turn signals for every turn or lane change, even if the rider thinks no one will see it.
- Combining hand signals and turn signals to draw more attention to themselves.
- Using reflective tape and stickers to increase conspicuity.
- Positioning themselves in the lane where they will be most visible to other drivers.
- Never driving while impaired.

"The message to all drivers and motorcyclists is: Help to share in the responsibility of keeping all road users safe, and do your part by safely "Sharing the Road."



The weather held true for the event. The morning started out quite Chilly, but as the day progressed it warned up rather nicely under clear blue skies. After filling our bellies with a delicious lunch, we all gathered in the parking lot where we held the drawings for prizes and made some announcements. Several Members won door prizes and the 50/25/25 prize was won by Bill Smith of Chapter T and Bill Livingston of Chapter H.

Georgia Chapter D was presented the **2012 Georgia Chapter of the Year Award**, as well as recognition for achiev-

I NEVER EVEN SAW THEM...

Did that grab your attention? I bet you immediately flashed back to an incident that happened to you. Once again if you ride on two wheels it's not a question of if....it's a question of when.

My own reminder occurred not that long ago. It was on Flat Rock road, a road I ride at least 5 times a week, if not more. As vou head westbound the curve slopes down and away to the left making an almost complete sweeping 90 degree radius. The eastbound approach is blocked by somewhat vegetation and mailbox. Posted speed limit is 35mph. What makes this turn unique is the fact that at its apex there are two side streets that converge at a 90 degree angle and meet at just about the same point.

It is because of this I always approach this turn with extreme caution. I downshift one gear and pay extra attention to opposing traffic. This particular morning as I approached the curve I noticed a mini van coming from the opposite direction with its left turn signal on. I said to myself "I know she's not going to turn in front of me....she has to see me". Wrong! I was already into the turn, when she turned in front of me. I made a quick downshift and got on the brakes; but not too hard because I was already turning and did not want to stand the bike straight up. Halfway through her turn she saw me and gave

a little wave followed by a shrug of her shoulders. I believe that was her way of saying she was sorry and she didn't see me. Meanwhile I was saying things like "Gosh and Darn!" As luck would have it I was able to slow down and maneuver to my left narrowly avoiding an almost certain accident. Yes, I did have to do an underwear check, but I survived. "Live to ride another day!"...that is my motto.

I actually credit my high school Drivers Ed instructor. He always preached "Always Leave Yourself an Out." Although high school is farther behind in my rear view mirror then I care to admit. I still try to follow that advice whether on 4 wheels or 2. I interpret that to mean: stay ever vigilant, don't let you guard down and always try to leave room to maneuver, you know, a way out.

There are two points I'd like to make and the first involves complacency. It would be very easy during the daily commute, on local roads, close to home, to put one's self auto pilot. You on know....relax....daydreamlisten to the music....think about your honey do list, etc. Any of those can be dangerous, if not disastrous! Believe it or not this malady even has a name: Inattentional blindness. For now let's just say we must always have our "A" game on. You know, head on a swivel giving your undivided attention to the task at hand.

The second point involves visibility, not only what we can see but how about our visibility to other vehicles we share the road with. We can add driving lights and flashing brake lights, not to mention oscillating headlights, plus any other kind of light(s) your electrical system, and bank account, can handle, all of which increase our visibility and are definitely money well spent. But, have you considered the color of your helmet? Were you aware that wearing a white helmet reduces your risk of crashing by 24%?* Or that riders wearing reflective or florescent clothing reduced their risk of crash related injury by 37%?* Perform this self test the next time you encounter an on coming motorcyclist-see how well you notice a rider with a dark helmet and dark clothing compared to a motorcyclist wearing a light colored helmet and lighter clothing. Most roadways are black asphalt which makes discerning a rider in dark colors more difficult. Now add shade or shadows or better vet night time. Here is one more point to ponder: dark colors absorb light/heat and lighter colors reflect light/ heat. I don't know about you but I find it plenty hot enough just riding here in the south without adding to my heat load.
